Falmouth City Council met for a Public Hearing regarding MRA and LGEA at 3:30 pm on October 4, 2017 with Mayor Ron Stinson presiding. Council members present: April DeFalco, Amy Hitch, Amy Hurst, and Sebastian Ernst.

**Public Hearing**

Public Hearing was opened to take into consideration written or oral comments and suggestions from the public regarding use of the Municipal Road Aid (MRA) and Local Government Economic Assistance Funds (LGEA) for FY 17-18. The proposed use of MRA funds are for road improvements such as resurfacing, rehabilitation, and/or reconstruction for City streets. Funds will be used for reconstruction and maintenance of roads including expenses such as striping lines on Shelby Street, possible sealing of the veterans parking lot and the boat dock, filling potholes, as well as various other street conditions. LGEA will be used for allowable expenditures such as roads, recreation, airport and or economic development, but not limited to these.

The City projects that there will be an estimated total of \$104,974.03 available for the fiscal year 2017/18 for Municipal Road Aid Program; which includes a beginning balance from previous years' carryover of \$57,050.18; plus, anticipated 2017/18 estimated receipts of \$47,923.85.


The City projects that there will be an estimated total of \$58,977.03 available for the fiscal year 2017/18 for Local Government Economic Assistance LGEA Funds; which includes a beginning balance from previous years' carryover of \$43,977.03; plus, anticipated 2017/18 estimated receipts of \$15,000.00.

No members of the public were present to voice any opinions or concerns, nor were any written comments submitted to the city in regards to MRA or LGEA funds. City Council held the meeting open for 30 minutes. During this time Council discussed the road striping that was planned for the following day and some other possible road improvements.

With no further business to come before the Council a motion to adjourn was made by Council Member Hurst with a second by Council Member DeFalco. Motion passed unanimously.
